Disposable Chip Timing Proposal

This proposal is for Northfield's Frank Connolly Memorial Mile Run on July 4, 2025. We will be providing you with computerized chip timing with disposable chips. We are quoting this for a 12ft wide common start / finish line with chip start and chip finish timing systems. This is based on an out and back course. As part of our package, we are providing you with live searchable results on our website.

Event Name: 2025 Northfield's Frank Connolly Memorial Mile Run

Event Date/Time: <u>July 4, 2025 – Start time 8:30am</u>

Event Type: <u>1 Mile Run</u>
Estimated Participants: <u>600</u>

JB Sports Timing will provide the following services:

- Hold regular telephone conference calls with your team to review race plans.
- Set up the race online registration on RunSignUp. We will keep online registration open until the race day. This way, the race day signup can all be done online. The City of Northfield needs to set up banking information inside RunSignUp. This way all registration fees get paid to the City of Northfield. The online registration site can't open up until this is done.
- We will attach chips to our generic bibs for the 1-mile runners.
- We will provide bibs to you on race day July 4, 2025. I will assign each participant's bib number who signs up for the 1 mile run on RunSignUp before July 3, 2025, at 12pm. Bibs will be labeled with runners' information.
- Provide a laptop for on-site registration. (You must provide 2 volunteers to type runners' information into the computer.)
- Set up our timing systems and provide staff to run the systems on race day.
- Provide a 12ft wide common start / finish line with a chip timing system.
- Provide a race clock at the finish line.
- Provide HD Camera for finish line backup.
- Provide a 2,000 watts generator for all equipment supplied by JB Sports Timing.
- Provide printed overall race results by division and age group rankings about 45 minutes after start of event.
- Post full searchable race results to our website (www.jbsportstiming.com) at event completion.

Race promoters will provide the following:

- Provide all volunteers needed for the race day of registration, bib & shirt pickup.
- Ensure we can begin setting up our equipment at least 1.5 hours prior to the start of the race.
- Ensure that we have a minimum of 1.5 hours to break down our equipment and pack it up.
- Determine the racecourse and perform all course setup except for the finish line chute. This may include, but is not limited to, water stations, cones, and police to shut down roads / manage traffic.

Vendor Agreement Between the City of Northfield and JB Sports Timing

Providing Race Timing Service for the Frank Connolly Memorial Mile Run on July 4, 2025

- 1. Hold Harmless/Indemnification Provision. <u>JB Sports Timing</u> agrees to indemnify the <u>City of Northfield</u>, its agents, servants, employees and elected officials, and save them harmless against and from any and all claims, suits and costs of every kind, type or description, and any and all damages and liability to which they may be subjected, by reason of injury to the person or property of third parties resulting from or in any way arising out of their services while providing race management services as approved by the <u>City of Northfield</u>, and for any and all negligent acts of <u>JB Sports Timing</u>, and any employees or volunteers working with <u>JB Sports Timing</u> in the performance of all activities.
- Insurance. As further assurance to the City of Northfield, but not in any way limiting JB Sports Timing liability for indemnification, they shall supply the City of Northfield with a Certificate of Insurance (COI) evidencing the type and amount of coverage described herein to substantiate that such insurance is in full force and effect. During the performance of the activities JB Sports Timing shall keep in force at least the following insurance:
 - a) **Commercial General Liability** insurance or its equivalent for bodily injury, personal and advertising injury and property damage including loss of use, with minimum limits of:

\$1,000,000 each occurrence;

\$1,000,000 personal and advertising injury;

\$2,000,000 general aggregate per project;

\$2,000,000 products/completed operations aggregate

This insurance shall include:

Liability arising from premises operations.

<u>City of Northfield</u>, including all elected and appointed officials, all employees and volunteers, all boards, commissions and/or authorities shall be added as additional insured on the general liability policy with respect to activities performed by <u>JB Sports Timing for the City</u> during the Frank Connolly Memorial Mile Run on July 4, 2025. A copy of the additional insured endorsement(s) shall be attached to the certificate.

Coverage shall be primary to the additional insureds and shall not be contributing with any other insurance or similar protection available to the additional insureds, whether other available insurance be primary, contributing or excess. <u>JB Sports Timing</u> hereby grants the <u>City of Northfield</u> a waiver of any right to subrogation which any insurer may acquire by virtue of the payment of any loss.

Grant Applications

FY2026 Community Funding Project

- Congressman VanDrew announced the application process was open for Community Grant Funding through the House Appropriations Committee. Applications are due to be submitted by March 14, 2025.
- > The Northfield application will be for the construction of basketball and pickleball courts at Birch Grove Park.
- The application was successfully submitted on March 14, 2025.

2. FY2024 NJDCA Local Recreation Improvement Grant (LRIG)

- The New Jersey Department of Community Affairs has announced that they are accepting LRIG applications and the submission deadline is February 27, 2024. The LRIG application was submitted on February 23, 2024.
- > Grant awards were announced on May 31, 2024 and the City was awarded \$63,000.00.
- The City requested that due to budget constraints, the project be revised to be closer in cost to the grant award. Our office contacted the NJDCA in February of 2025. The NJDCA will allow for a change in scope in the project and will allow engineering costs to be submitted with the construction estimate.
- Our office submitted a revised proposal on March 12, 2025 based on this information.
- ➤ The NDCA approved the revised scope of work of a stone parking lot and the inclusion of engineering design fees on March 21, 2025. A time extension request was not approved, and the project must be completed by April 2026.
- > The project is in the design phase.

3. <u>USDA Water and Waste Disposal-Predevelopment Planning Grant (PPG)</u>

- On June 10, 2024 the USDA awarded the City \$17,000.00 for the PPG grant and the next step requires the City to file the full application.
- The next phase is for the City to authorize our office for an engineering study our proposal for this project was submitted on February 12, 2025.
- ➤ The City approved the proposal for this work with Resolution No. 70-2025 on February 18, 2025.
- ➤ The City DPW recommended that the forcemains be considered for the study rather than the gravity mains due to their age and history of pipe bursts. Our office contacted the USDA on March 26, 2025 and their engineer stated a change of scope from the original submission is allowable.
- > The City selected the forcemains be studied, and the USDA was notified of this on April 23, 2025.

4. New Jersey Department of Transportation Local Projects Fund (NJDOT LTPF)

- The City has selected the reconstruction of Forrest Drive from Juniper Drive to Mill Road for FY2024 of the Local Transportation Project Fund.
- The application was submitted to the System for Administering Grants Electronically (SAGE) on June 26, 2024.
- > This application is currently still pending with the NJDOT.

5. New Jersey Department of Transportation Municipal Aid

- ➤ The City has selected the reconstruction of Juniper Drive from Cedarbridge Road to Mill Road as its project for FY2025 Municipal Aid.
- ➤ The City was awarded \$229,190.00 on November 13, 2024 for this project. The total project cost estimate is \$355,824.70.
- > Survey work has been completed and plans are being prepared.

Engineering

Street Excavation and Sidewalk Ordinance

- Our office was asked to review and revise the street excavation and sidewalk ordinance. We have been coordinating with the City to update this ordinance.
- Our office sent a draft ordinance to the City on May 21, 2024.
- Our office met with the City on July 15, 2024 to review City revisions and comments.
- > The second draft of the ordinance was sent to the City on September 4, 2024.
- > Final draft of the ordinance was sent to the City on November 18, 2024.
- > The City passed a revised ordinance and it became legal publication on February 22, 2025.

2. Slipline Repairs Zion and Mill Roads, Zion and Davis Roads

- The bid opening was held on April 10, 2025.
- > The City selected to award Bid Alternative #3, slipline repair and manhole rehabilitation at Zion and Mill and Zion and Shore Roads. A Letter of recommendation was submitted to the City on April 23, 2025.

3. Habitat for Humanity Housing Project

- Our office submitted a proposal for the Habitat for Humanity Project on Block 69 Lot 1.02 and Block 66 Lot 11 on August 5, 2024.
- On September 6, 2024, our office issued an email with further detail of stormwater management options in response to the summary email issued by the City on September 5, 2024.
- On October 1, 2024 a meeting was held with representatives from the City, Habitat for Humanity and our office. Habitat representatives stated that engineering costs would be covered under the DCA grant that Habitat will submit. Habitat's engineer will be responsible for preparing a complete project estimate.
- > Our office revised their original estimate to include all anticipated site plan engineering costs including anticipated permit fees, with a not to exceed amount as directed by City council.
- Our office transmitted a proposal to the City on December 10, 2024 and is ready to begin work upon authorization from the City.
- Our office provided answers to the Habitat for Humanity's project questionnaire on April 8, 2025 at the closed session of the City Council Meeting.
- > The City has authorized our office to proceed with engineering services for this project via Resolution No. 111-2025 on April 22, 2025.
