Mitigation

- ▶ Atlantic County Multi-Jurisdiction Hazard Mitigation Plan Update
 - ▶ Convened Jurisdictional Assessment Team
 - ▶ Reviewed Hazard and Risk Assessment / Vulnerabilities
 - ▶ Identified 14 Potential Mitigation Projects

Mitigation - continued

- ▶ Removal of dead/diseased trees on public and private properties
- ▶ 'Provide for emergency power generation for Public Works Facility
- ▶ 'Identify and Maintain a facility(location) for emergency cooling/warming centers
- ▶ Public Outreach to identify vulnerable population
- ▶ Purchase and installation of public warning siren/public address system.
- ▶ Construct EOC to local hurricane standards and state of the art technology
- ▶ Identify and design improvements to existing storm drainage problem areas

Mitigation - continued

- ▶ Purchase and installation of mapping software (ArcViewer is free) with plotter
- ▶ Acquisition of a mass-notification software
- ▶ Install "sliplining" of sewer pipes throughout the city.
- ▶ Work with engineering to map out existing storm water piping and flow direction
- ▶ Identify the location of Repetitive Loss properties, investigate mitigation options, and open communications with property owners. Priority will be with the SRL property
