READING AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

On a motion of Councilman Dewees with a second of Councilman Utts, all members present, with the exception of Councilman Notaro who abstained, were in favor of approving the minutes of February 3, 2022 and February 8, 2022 without formal reading.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Chau announced we were all just introduced to our new SLEO, there were now two, and that expanded our services in the Police Department. He added that it had been a challenge to find applicants. The officer who had been doing code enforcement had been doing very well, Mayor Chau was happy we combined these services. Mayor Chau, Councilman Dewees, Councilwoman Bucci and Councilman Leeds attended the recent Atlantic County League of Municipalities meeting, there was a very good discussion regarding the PILOT program. It was an eye-opening presentation to see just how much money the County is losing. The next Atlantic County League of Municipalities meeting would be at the Atlantic City Country Club.

Council President Polistina asked why the money was being lost.

Mayor Chau replied, the terms were different than originally agreed upon.

CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT

Engineer Nassar prepared the Engineer's report and sent it but something went wrong, it appeared not to have been received by the Council. Engineer Nassar reported that he and Solicitor Facenda appeared before the Planning Board for the Zion Pump Station. The result will be that the City's infrastructure would all be on one lot. He received the flood damage prevention ordinance from the Department of Environmental Protection, their revisions were minor. Engineer Nassar would review it to see if it conflicts with any sections of our existing code, and would have it for introduction on the March 8th agenda.

Mayor Chau noted that he had been in touch with many realtors, there was no inventory in Northfield, he didn't know whether or not that is a good thing. They were excited about the development of the Arthur Henry site.

Councilman Smith, to Engineer Nassar, advised he had a resident ask about the Merritt Drive project, he asked when it would start.

Engineer Nassar replied it was supposed to be in March but may be delayed due to utility work; it would likely be early in April.

Clerk Canesi asked those in Zoom to raise their hand if they wished to speak.
